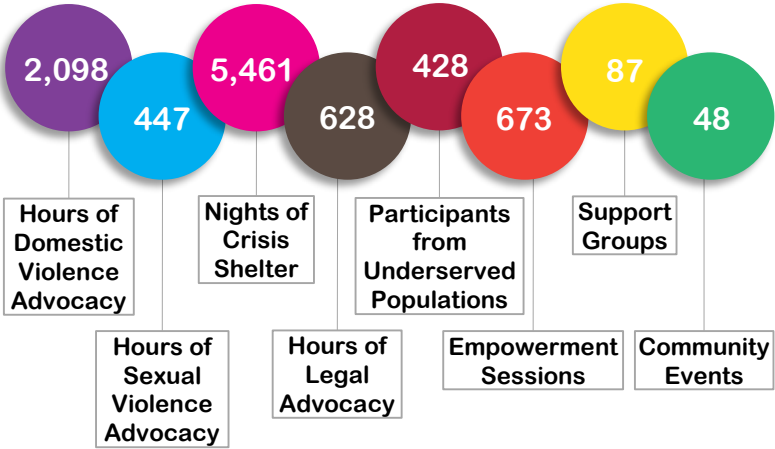

Programs & Services

Domestic Violence

CAAFA's trained advocates work with individuals and families impacted by domestic violence to set goals aimed at creating self-sufficient lives, free of abuse.

Sexual Violence

Our trained advocates work with survivors of sexual assault, including prison rape and military sexual assault advocacy, and sex trafficking

Crisis Shelter

CAAFA provides a safe, secure and confidential place to stay with comprehensive services for domestic and sexual violence survivors. The shelter also runs a 24-hour crisis line.

Legal Advocacy

CAAFA's Legal Advocates provide information about legal processes, options and rights, and offer court accompaniment.

Culture & Underserved Populations

All of CAAFA's services are tailored to each individual, including accommodations for Limited English Proficiency, and physical or mental disability, and unique cultural needs.

Empowerment

One-on-One sessions with a trained counselor provide individualized support, affirmation, validation, information, and education.

Support Groups

Weekly support groups facilitated by a certified Advocate enable participants to share experiences, gain perspective and support, and learn about domestic and sexual violence.

Community Education & Prevention

CAAFA provides presentations, literature and community booths to increase community awareness about domestic and sexual violence.
